one part And Aubrey Middleton of the County of Southampton and State aforesaid of the
other part. Witnesseth that the said Thomas Ridgely and John B. his wife William B.
Goodwyn and Elizabeth his wife, John Maclewan and ^{formerly} Elizabeth his wife Mary McKillo
George B. Lang and Martha his wife John A. B. Plant and Sarah his wife have and dis-
tributed of John A. or let dec^d in consideration of the sum of £200 Four hundred
dollars, lawful money of this Commonwealth, to them in hand paid or thence to be paid by
the said Aubrey Middleton at or before the insuring and delivery of these presents, their
receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Have bargained and sold And by these presents
do, and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Aubrey Middleton his heirs
and assigns, a certain tract and parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southamp-
ton aforesaid and bounded as follows. Beginning at the flat swamp bridge over the road a new
Corner made, thence down the various courses of the sum of said flat swamp to the mouth of a
small branch a corner for the land of Lawrence Cook dec^d thence up the sum of said branch 100
poles to a black gum in said Cooks line thence along his line of marked trees S 29¹/₂ E 37 poles
thence S 24¹/₂ E 14 poles thence S 18 E 15 poles thence S 21¹/₄ E 67 poles thence S 22¹/₂ E 4 poles
to a large white oak thence S 60 E 19¹/₂ poles to a dead dogwood a corner in Cooks line March
East end of the long old field substitute it by a red oak and two erect gums thence N 72 E 11 poles
to a white oak thence S 39 N 20 poles thence S 37¹/₂ N 46 poles to a post oak thence S 7¹/₂ E 6 poles
to a white oak a corner for said Cooks land also a corner for Littleberry Mason thence along
