M Dick and Dorothy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of fifty three dollars and forty
cents to them in hand paid by the said John Hargrave at or before the concluding and delivery of
these presents the receipt whereof they the said Mills M Dick and Dorothy his wife doth
hereby acknowledge themselves fully satisfied Content and paid bargains sold aforesaid
and confirm and by these presents doth hereby bargain and sell again enfold and forever before
unto the said John Hargrave his heirs and assigns a certain negro plantation tract or parcel of
land situated lying and being in the County aforesaid containing thirteen and two fifths acres
bouned as follows to wit Beginning at a corner for Patima Dick in John Hargrave's line
thence along his line at 30^{1/4} E 37 poles to a post oak thence N 24 E 56 1/2 poles to a sassafras
thence at 32^{1/2} E 12 poles to a black gum and white oak standing in the rich muck branch a
corner for Nancy Pops thence along her line up said branch at 85 1/2 poles to a small pine
a corner for said Nancy Pops and said John Hargrave thence along said Hargrave's line
at 79^{1/4} W 45 poles to a post a new corner made for said Mills M Dick in said Hargrave's line
thence along a new line of mackie trees 1 30^{1/4} N 87 poles to a small pine a new corner made
