I, Charlotte Nickolson of the County of Southampton  
for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I have to my Grandson William  
A. Pinto son of Alexander P. Pinto of the County aforesaid as well as for the further con-  
sideration of the sum of five dollars to me in hand paid at or before the concluding or delivery  
of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to have given and granted,  
and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William Pinto his Executors ad-  
ministrators and assigns forever the following my slaves to wit: Polly, Pamela, Henry, Albert and Jack  
a Negroe woman and her child Marcus. To have and to hold the said negro  
slaves with the future increase of the females thereof unto him the said William Pinto  
his Executors administrators and assigns forever: And the said Charlotte Nickolson for  
herself her Executors administrators and assigns the said negro slaves above mentioned  
and the future increase of the females thereof unto the said William Pinto his Execu-  
tors administrators and assigns against the claim of her the said Charlotte Nickolson  
her Executors and administrators and against the claim or claims of all and every person  
or persons what so ever shall and will warrant and forever defend them by these presents  
W.M. Mcff whose the said Charlotte Nickolson hath hild her hand and  
affid her seal this 17 day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and thirty one.

Nicholson I, Charlotte Nickolson of the County of Southampton am  
I, held and firmly bound unto Alexander P. Pinto of the same County in the sum of Two  
Thousand dollars to be paid to the said Alexander P. Pinto his certain Attorney his  
Executor administrators or assigns to which payment well and truly to be made I bind  
myself my heirs Executors and assigns firmly by these presents sealed with my seal and dated  
this 17 day of August 1831. The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas  
the above named Charlotte Nickolson and Alexander P. Pinto on or about the last of December  
1831 did jointly execute two notes or Bonds to William Richardson for the sum of Five  
hundred dollars each with an endorsement on each of the said Notes or Bonds that the sum of  
money thereby secured should not be demanded until Mary Richardson the wife of the  
I Richardson should relinquish her right of dower in a certain tract or parcel of land  
conveyed by the said John T Richardson to the said Alexander P. Pinto and Charlotte  
Nickolson by Deed bearing date the 9<sup>th</sup> day of January 1828 and admitted to record  
the same day. which bonds or notes have been transferred to and are now in the  
possession of a certain Thomas Trotter and since the execution of the said two bonds  
or notes an arrangement has been made between the said Charlotte Nickolson and  
Alexander P. Pinto by which it is understood between them the said Charlotte Nick-  
olson and Alexander P. Pinto by which she the said Charlotte Nickolson is to pay
