This Indenture made this third day of September in the year 1831.
 Between Alexander Pinto and his wife of the first part Henry B Vaughan
 of the said County of the second part and James W Parker of the County aforesaid of
 the third part. Whereas it is agreed that the said Alexander Pinto is greatly indebted
 to the said James W Parker in the sum of Eight thousand One hundred
 dollars by several bonds executed by the said Alexander Pinto to the said
 James W Parker, and the said Alexander Pinto being desirous to secure the payment
 of the aforesaid sum of money and the interest that may accrue thereon this Indenture therefore
 Whereas it is agreed that the said Alexander Pinto and his wife for and in consideration
 of the sum of five dollars lawful money to them in hand paid by the said Henry B
 Vaughan before the ensualing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth
 grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Henry B Vaughan his heirs etc
 of a certain piece or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southam-
 ton and being the same conveyed by the said James W Parker and his wife
 to the said Alexander Pinto and bounded as follows: Beginning at the
 intersection of Crawford's road and Thomas swamp thence down the said swamp the vari-
 us courses thereof to Blom's mill pond at present belonging to Thomas Kelley and the
 intersection of that and the Schoolhouse branch thence down that branch the various
 courses thereof to a lightwood stump a corner of Thomas Underwood thence
 along a line of marked trees at 30° W 6 poles thence N 25 W 5 2 poles thence
 at 47° 5 2 poles thence E 46 W 6 poles to the road thence the same course at 46
 W 44 poles to a point a corner of Thomas Underwood thence N 42 E 3 6 poles thence
 at 49° E 3 2 poles to a point a corner of Thomas Underwood on the side of Blom's road
 thence along the said road at 49° E 3 2 poles thence still along the said Crawford's road at
 33° E 3 10 poles to the beginning and containing by estimation seven hundred and thirty
 acres more or less it being the same conveyed by H B Vaughan to James
 W Parker by Deed dated the 7th of January 1825 and duly recorded in the Clerk
 Office of the County aforesaid also the following slaves to wit that Charles Barn
 Lucy, Lucy, Archy, Sam, Henry, James, Bramby, Patsey, Mopp, Franky, Maria,
 Harriet and Lucy six horses & two mules thirty six head of cattle forty two head of
 sheep one hundred & four of hogs one other gins one still ten gins three carts ten tables
 two tables to have and to hold the said premises or parcels of land with all
 the other premises and appurtenances thereto belonging together with the said
 slaves and other property aforesaid unto the said Henry B Vaughan his heirs
 Executors &C forever in trust nevertheless that if the said A Pinto his
 heirs Executors or Administrators shall well and truly pay the several sums of money
 herein mentioned with all the interest that may accrue thereon when the several
 notes aforesaid shall become due according to their tenor and effect then this indenture
 to be void or else to remain in full force and effect. But if the said
 Alexander Pinto shall make default in the several payments as they may
 become due or either of them then and in such case of failure the said H B Vaughan
 on request of the said J W Parker his heirs Executors &c shall after having given notice
 for thirty days in some most widely circulated newspaper in Virginia and having
 given notice of the time and place of sale also by advertisements in the most public
