Between John Drake of the one part and Mary Drake of the other part, both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, viz that the said John Drake for and in consideration of the sum of \$400 dollars sold and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the said Mary Drake her heirs and assigns all his right title and interest in a certain parcel of land situated and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia It being his proportion of the land allotted to John Drake dec^d which she claims from her father Thomas Drake dec^d Estate To have and to hold the said John Drake's interest in said land, tenements and hereditaments with all and singular the premises to the said Mary Drake or intended to be bargain and sold with every of their rights members and appurtenances unto her the said Mary Drake her heirs and assigns forever free from the claim or claims of him the said John Drake or either of his heirs or assigns and all and every persons or persons who come shall and will demand and defend by these presents. This Indenture made this 15th day of September in the year of Christ 1830 Between Willis Borning of the first part, William Lawrence of the second part, of the County of Southampton and Charles E. Lawrence of the County of Edge of Virginia of the third part and all of the State of Virginia Whereas the said Willis Borning stands indebted unto the said William Lawrence in the sum of One hundred and one dollar and 70^{cts} by said William Lawrence promissory note the 15th day of September 1830. and whereas the said Willis Borning on the 17th day of Jan^y 1831 meeting and desiring to save Esophamleph and secure the said William Lawrence in the aforesaid debt. At or by this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises, and also for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar lawful money of Virginia to the said Willis Borning in hand paid by the said Charles E. Lawrence at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by him the said Willis Borning have granted bargain and sold, and doth by these presents bargain and sell unto the said Willis E. Lawrence his heirs and assigns one negro man Caesar To have and to hold the property above mentioned made unto the said Charles E. Lawrence his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Lawrence his heirs and assigns forever but upon this special trust and condition that provide the said Willis Borning his heirs and assigns shall find to pay to the said Willis
