WITNE all men by these presents that I Thomas Gray of the County of Southampton in this Consideration of the natural love and affection which I have and bear to my daughter Ann Gray as well as for and in consideration of the sum of six dollars unto me in hand paid by the said Ann Gray, at or before the end making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted and given and by these presents do grant give convey unto my said daughter Ann Gray, for and during her natural life, one tract part ation and parcel of land, and appurtenances which I purchased of one Edmund Wood and his wife which is of record more called and known by the name of Wood's field one tract plantation and parcel of land which is adjoining the same and which I purchased of Samuel Fox and his wife and one other tract and plantation adjoining thereto before mentioned which I purchased of one Robert Maynard and his wife and an all of record as well appears and bounded and held as the same is expressed. And also the following articles of property Viz. Desk, Book case and Religious Books one cloth's Press one dressing table with the dressing Glass and Boxes two small square tables one tea table one candle stand two dining tables one dozen Mahogany chairs, three iron chairs, one easy chair, one dozen cups and saucers half a dozen Glasses, three coffee pots, two tea pots, two decanters, one dozen knives one large iron pot, two smaller iron ovens one Griddle and waffle irons, two tea Kettles three trays four Tubs, four spails, six tin pans six buckets, two water pails, one pair of salt boxes two Bids, two Bedsteads and two changes of Bed's furniture or clothing to each one brass or Iron Bed and furniture one large pine table one chair and stool. And then only proper use and behoof, having reserved to myself the free possession and use or occupation of the aforesaid property and all things herein and hereafter given or loaned or intended to be given or loaned, I have given and granted the same unto my said daughter Ann Gray the foregoing acknowledged
