

Southampton County. In the Clerk's Office the 17<sup>th</sup> day of October 1831.  
 The said Dr. of Gift was procured by the oath of John Odomedy and Henry H. and two of the Jurors  
 there and having been sworn in the Clerk's Office the 18<sup>th</sup> day of October 1831. By the oath of  
 O. W. & P. B. a writ of Habeas Corpus was issued to the said Prisoner and a Court held for the County  
 appeared the 21<sup>st</sup> day of November 1831. The said Dr. of Gift was returned upon the  
 proceedings of the day.

This indenture made and entered into on this 15<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty one Between Lewis Browne of the first part  
 Bennett K. Whitfield the Trustee of the said Lewis Browne and William McCutty of the third  
 Examined before me all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Whereas the said Lewis Browne  
 to Bennett K. Whitfield justly indebted to the said William McCutty by Bond bearing even date with these presents  
 July 23<sup>rd</sup> 1832 in the sum of twenty six dollars and thirty seven cents which debt with the legal interest  
 thereon according to the said Lewis Browne is willing and desirous to secure to the said  
 Bennett K. Whitfield that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar of lawful money of  
 Virginia to the said Browne in hand paid by the said Bennett K. Whitfield Trustee  
 at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl-  
 edged by the said Lewis Browne have given granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed  
 released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release  
 and confirm to the said Bennett K. Whitfield his heirs and assigns forever the following personal  
 property to wit: two small hams one cut and seven cut wheels three feather beds and furniture  
 one loom and gear two pine chests one pine table one wood wheel one iron pot and hook  
 one frying pan three wood hoes one grub hoe one mowing axe washing tub the water pails  
 one meal stand and saw and three stacks of blade fodder twenty five barrels of corn also  
 all my Crop Cotton together with all the right title and interest of the said Lewis Browne  
 in and to the above mentioned personal property hereby granted or intended to be hereby  
 granted To have and to hold the said hereby granted or intended to be hereby granted  
 personal property as above mentioned unto the said Bennett K. Whitfield the Trustee  
 his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof  
 of the said Bennett K. Whitfield his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever  
 and the said Lewis Browne for himself his heirs Executors administrators and assigns  
 and agreed to and with the said Bennett K. Whitfield his heirs Executors administrators  
 and assigns forever that the aforesaid personal property hereby conveyed unto the said  
 Bennett K. Whitfield his heirs Executors administrators and assigns against all persons whatsoever shall be  
 void warrant and forever defend by these presents inasmuch that the  
 said Bennett K. Whitfield his heirs Executors administrators shall permit the said Lewis Browne  
 to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said personal property hereby conveyed  
 or intended to be conveyed until default be made in the payment of the said sum of  
 twenty six dollars & thirty seven cents either in the whole or in part and thereafter  
 this further trust that the said Bennett K. Whitfield or his <sup>heirs</sup> Executors assigns shall  
 will as soon after the happening of such default of payment as he or they may think  
 proper or the said William McCutty his heirs assigns shall request sell all the  
 aforesaid personal property hereby conveyed or such part thereof as the said Trustee or  
 his representatives hereby authorized to act shall think sufficient for the purpose and
