White a certain parcel of land lying and being in the town of Southampton containing one hundred and sixty four and a half acres and bounded as follows. Beginning at a stake in a corner of road and running thence S 20° W to the main line of the mill Pond, leaving the other land of the said Williams & Richardson on the north then the main run of the said Mill Pond, to the old Cropping place, thence the old Challe Road to Ears or Johnson's line, thence said line to W^o Richardson's line, thence said line to the north along a new road to the beginning.
