and half acres to the same more or less To have and to hold the tract of land with its appurte-
nances hereto belonging unto the said William Prince his heirs and assigns forever and the said
Alexander P. Peete and Mary his wife doth hereby promise for themselves and their heirs that they
shall and will forever warrant and defend the rights and title of the above mentioned land unto
him the said William Prince his heirs and assigns forever notwithstanding which we have herunto

This Indenture made this 7th of November 1831 between Samuel Buck (a few acres) of the first
part William S. Mills of the second part and Robert J. Ricks of the third part witnesseth that the said
Samuel Buck being justly indebted to the said Robert J. Ricks in the sum of One
hundred and fifty dollars and thirty three and a third Cents current money of Virginia being anxious
to have him paid off and indemnify the said Robert J. Ricks as well as for the further consideration
of one dollar to him in hand paid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents hath
engaged granted and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto William
S. Mills his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit One horse cart and wheels
one saddle and bridle - one work star and yokes, two hulks, two match boxes and a sulky
seven hogs, five plough-hoes, two grubbing hoes, two mending tools, Oliver and hames, three axes
thirteen Cedar barrels - four feather beds, and bedsteads - six chairs, tongs and shovel - Two dinner
pots - two tea Pottles - one spider and sofa, meal stand present Crop of Corn, fodder peas and potash
one fence - two chests, spinning wheel and Cards - one lawn wheel - one house 2 storys 6 caps
and beams - one Cupboard - one desk of drawers - 2 pianos one poplar table. To have and
to hold the said property upon Trust nevertheless that if the said Samuel Buck shall
willingly pay unto the said Robert J. Ricks the sum above mentioned in Due, when it shall
be demanded by the said Robert J. Ricks then this indenture to be rendered to remain in full force
and virtue. But if the said Samuel Buck shall fail to make payment then the said William S. Mills
is authorized, having advertised the above named property, a reasonable time to sell the same for
cash and pay to Robert J. Ricks the sum due by Samuel Buck and the balance having defrayed
the expenses of the sale pay over to same Buck his heirs assigns per weight one hundred dollars the day of sealing and
