 To One thousand Eight hundred and thirty one Between Gordon Johnson of the first part  
 Gibsonson James Clayton of the second part and Wilson Stephenson of the third part all of the  
 County of Southampton and State of Virginia. witnesseth that the said Gordon  
 Examined Johnson for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty Eight dollars which said sum  
 to Wilson Stephenson is due from the said Gordon to the said Wilson Stephenson by Bond bearing date the  
 April 14<sup>th</sup> 1832 day of October 1831 as well as all other monies which may be due and owing from the  
 said Gordon Johnson to the said Wilson Stephenson by means of any bonds  
 of debt or paper whatever, as also for and in consideration of one dollar to him in hand  
 paid by the said James Clayton the receipt whereof the said Gordon Johnson  
 doth hereby acknowledge which grants bargains and sell and by these presents doth  
 hereby grant bargain and sell Convey & make over unto the said James Clayton  
 and his heirs forever all his right and interest in the following property to wit one  
 half of the land wherow the said Gordon Johnson now resides containing one  
 hundred acres more or less bounded by the land of James Clayton Joseph Joy,  
 Lemuel B. Simmonds land and the main run of Beacock Swamp belonging to  
 him the said Gordon Johnson To have and to hold with all the rights and incidents  
 of the said Gordon Johnson herein Conveyed or intended to be Conveyed to him the  
 said James Clayton his heirs and assigns forever upon this special trust nevertheless  
 that the said James Clayton upon being called upon by the aforesaid Wilson  
 Stephenson shall possess to sell all the right and interest of the said Gordon Johnson  
 to the above named land hereby Conveyed or intended to be Conveyed after advertising  
 the same and placing in the said County of Southampton for ten days previous at some  
 public house or store for cash and out of the money arising out of the said land
