This Indenture made and entered into this 4th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one between Gordon Johnson of the first part James Clayton of the second part and William Stephenson of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. *Witnesseth* that the said Gordon Johnson for and in consideration of the sum of sixty eight dollars which said sum is due from the said Gordon to the said William Stephenson by Bond bearing date the day of October 1831. as well as all other moneys which may be due and owing from the said Gordon Johnson to the said William Stephenson by means of any transfer of debt or paper whatever, as also for and in consideration of one dollar to him and him paid by the said James Clayton the receipt whereof the said Gordon Johnson doth hereby acknowledge, he hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth hereby grant bargain and sell convey & make over unto the said James Clayton and his heirs forever all his right and interest in the following property to wit and half of the land whereon the said Gordon Johnson now resides containing and provided acres ~~more or less~~ bounded by the land of James Clayton Joseph Squire Lemuel B. Comstock dec'd land and the main run of the creek Swamp belonging to him the said Gordon Johnson To have and to hold with all the right and interest of the said Gordon Johnson herein conveyed or intended to be conveyed to him the said James Clayton his heirs and assigns forever upon these special covenants to wit that the said James Clayton upon being thereto required by the aforesaid William Stephenson shall proceed to sell all the right and interest of the said Gordon Johnson to the above named land hereby conveyed or intended to be conveyed after advertising the time and place in the said County of Southampton for ten days previous at some public house or store for cash and out of the money arising out of said sale
