Witnessed This Indenture made and entered into on this the 16th day of October in the year of our Lord 1830 By and between Margaret Dick of the first part John Hargrave and Richard Jordan Guardians for the infants children of Eum Dick dec^d of the second part and Mills W. Vick of the third and last part all of said parties of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Attest the above named John Hargrave and Richard Jordan Guardians as aforesaid upon the following Conditions agreed to pay & satisfy certain debts and dues from the estate of Eum Dick dec^d to said Dick's Creditors thereby preventing suit or suits being instituted immediately affecting the interest of their said wards, and upon this Condition that Margaret Dick the mother of each of the said wards indemnifies us the said Hargrave and Jordan for paying as aforesaid the debts of the said Eum Dick to what ever extent we shall go in the discharge of said debts and dues Now therefore and for the further confirmation of the sum of one dollar to her the said Margaret Dick in hand payment the said Mills W. Vick at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the full receipt thereof is hereby acknowledged and from every part of which the said Mills W. Vick and all his legal representatives and assigns released acquitted and discharged have granted bargained and sold and do hereby grant bargain and sell unto the said Mills W. Vick his heirs and assigns as follows that is to say the said Margaret Dick have granted bargained and sold and do hereby grant interest and estate which she the said Margaret Dick has in and to a certain tract or parcel of Land lying on the South side of a stream River in the County aforesaid supposed to contain one hundred acres more or less it being the land of the
