This Indenture made this 8th day October in the year of our Lord one thousand
 Eight Hundred and thirty one Between John Horns & of the County of Northampton and State
 of Virginia of the first part Henry Morris of the County and State of the second part and
 Richard Morris of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina of the third
 part who is mutually chosen as Trustee: Witnesseth that whereas the said Henry
 having become security for the said John Horns in several Cases, and in all other
 Cases that he may become from this date until one thousand Eight Hundred and thirty
 four and all claims that the said John Horns is owing the said Henry Morris the said
 and the said John Horns being willing and desirous of securing him the said
 Henry Morris from all possibility of suffering by reason of aforesaid security
 Now This Indenture further Witnesseth that the said John Horns
 for and in consideration of the circumstances aforesaid as well for and in considera-
 tion of the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid by the said Richard Morris
 Trustee aforesaid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, have bargain and sold
 and by these presents grant bargain sell make over and convey unto him the
 said Richard Morris as Trustee aforesaid the following real and other estate to
 wit The tract of Land whereon now live containing one hundred and
 fifty seven acres be the same more or less and the following negro slaves to wit
 Lewis and Pelias also one certain land or note of hand secured by Thomas P.
 limited to the said John Horns for one hundred and fifty four dollars due on
 2^d day of December 1830 which bond was deposited in the hand of William
 Everett One riding Peg, Cask or casket, also all my household and kitchen furniture
 stock of all kind, farming utensils and all other property that I am now in possession
