This Indenture made and entered into this 19th day of November in the year one thousand Eight Hundred and thirty six Between: Edward Gray of the County of Southampton of the first part, Jesse Drury of the second part and Orris A. Bromm and Thomas Gray of the third part. Whereas the said Edward Gray of the first part is partly indebted to the said Bromm and Thomas Gray of the third part in a bond bearing equal date with these presents for the sum of Eight Hundred and forty Eight dollars and ten cents due the nineteenth day of August 1832 Drury the first and whereas the said Edward Gray is desirous and desirous to secure to the said Bromm and Thomas Gray of the third part when it shall become due and payable. This Indenture Therefore witnesseth that as well on consideration of the premises as of the sum of One dollar to be paid by the said Drury party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Edward Gray husband and sole and by these presents does bargain and sell grant and convey unto the said Jesse Drury all his interest of what ever description in the state both real and personal of Thomas Gray which was devised to him by the last will and testament of the said Thomas Gray; all his interest in the plantation adjoining the land of William Jackson in the County of Sussex Bromm as the Spring Swamp plantation and in the tract of land which the late Thomas Gray resided in the County of Southampton and also the following property to wit: One desk and book case, six Windsor chairs three bed and furniture, two riding saddles three tables, six table cloths, two pair of Andirons, two guns two Caskets, one medicine chest eleven silver Table Spoons eleven silver tea Spoons, four blankets, four bed quilts four counterpane, two looking glasses, two Cases and bottles, two chafing dishes, Popes Works, Repairs, works, Household Hospital for wit and all his other books, nine mahogany chairs, forty High one four barrel Stills, one Immire and sixty Casks, two yoke of Oxen three Cows three Pigs, forty four sheep, one silver watch, one dozen knives and forks, one double gig and trap, one single gig and harness, the Repairs works, ten tumbril carts, two ox carts and chairs, one Immire barrel of Corn, one Corn Sheller, one Corn band, one half bushel, a pair of Stands, three ploughs, one bucket, a barrel still, four wire sieves one Cedar trough, two apple mills and seats, one pair of iron wheels, one galley pot, six plaster casts moulded, two carrying Benches, three barrels wine, one brass shield, one pair of kitchen Andirons, seven pots &c and all the other property purchased by the said Edward Gray at the sale of Thomas Gray dec'd. To have and to hold the said bargain and purchase of Land with them appurtenances and the other property aforesaid to him the said Jesse Drury and his heirs and assigns and to his and their only proper use and behoof forever upon trust nevertheless that the said Edward Gray is to retain possession of the said property until default shall be made by him in the payment of the said note where it shall become due and payable and on such default the said Jesse Drury or his heirs after advertising the time and place of sale for fifteen days at some public place shall be sufficient to pay so much of the said debt to the said Bromm and Thomas Gray as shall be together with the expenses attending this trust: and the said Edward Gray covenants with the said Jesse Drury that he shall have a good title to the said tract of land and other property and shall have possession of the same for the purpose aforesaid, whereas a sale shall become necessary under this trust and the said Jesse Drury or his heirs covenants with the said Gray and the said Bromm respectively that he will and truly execute the Trust hereby imposed on him and the said Bromm covenants with the said Gray that he will release the said property from this indenture whensoever the said
