This Indenture made and entered into this 15th day of October 1831, between William Holt of Southampton County of the first part, William Holliman of the County of Edge of the second part, and Richard Brothe of Curry County of the third part, Witness that the said William Holt stands justly indebted to the said Richard Brothe in the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars lawful money of the State of Virginia as well more fully appears by reference to his note of the above date. Now therefore to have the said four hundred and fifty dollars with the growing interest until paid and for the further sum of one dollar to him the said William Holt in and paid by the said William Holliman the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said William Holt hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell to the said William Holliman and his heirs &c. one certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton and containing one hundred and twenty acres (more or less, bounded as follows Viz. On the north and side by the land of Conrad Bailey's heirs, on the south by the land of Joseph Harts' heirs and on the west by the land of Henry Holliman also one negro man named Eliza To have and to hold the aforesaid land Tenements &c. and the said negro man, slaves and every part and parcel thereof, to him the said William Holliman his heirs and assigns forever Upon Trust Nevertheless that the said William Holliman may and shall at any time after the 25th day of December 1831, upon the request of the said Richard Brothe advertise and sell the lands and slave before mentioned for ready money after giving ten days public notice thereof and out of the money arising therefrom first pay and discharge all reasonable expenses attending the premises then the debt aforesaid and the cost plus of any pay and return to the said William Holt or his legal representatives In Witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day by year first above written, In Witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day by year first above written
