Third Indenture made and entered into this 31st day of December 1831 between Thomas William Teller of the first part, Littleton R. Edwards of the second part, and Henry Blew, the third part, witnesseth that whereas the said William T. Blew, Blew, Blew, pretty well unto the said Henry Blew in the following sum of money, one thousand and two hundred and five hundred on the 31st December 1833 with interest from the date thereof to Joseph Newfangle amount is due. Now the said William T. Blew being desirous to indemnify his son for Small him the said Henry Blew, the payment thereof but more especially for the sum of one 15th day 1836 dollar to him in hand paid by him the said Littleton R. Edwards before the making and delivering of these presents - the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that the said William T. Blew hath granted bargained and sold and doth by these presents make bargain and sell to him the said Littleton R. Edwards his son and assigns forever Two parts or parcels of land containing by late survey thereon is an acre and a half lying and being in the County of Southampton and in the district of Northgate Parish. One of the said tracts bounded as follows to wit by the land of Ann Stephen, Thomas Ridley, James Blew, Bennett Edwards and Archibald Dick the other tract by the land of James Blew, Richard Dick the heir of John Rockell, deceased. William Dick and James Rockell the wife thereof being a part of the tract of land which Richard Rockell devised and professed and which by his last will he bequeathed to James Blew, Henry Blew, Robert Blew and Samuel Blew. To have and to hold with all the rights and privileges of the before mentioned land to him the said Littleton R. Edwards his son and assigns forever and to the said William T. Blew doth for himself his heirs executors administrators or assigns warrant and will forever defend all right title claim and interest to the before mentioned property to him the said Littleton R. Edwards his son and assigns forever. Upon the following Term next. That if the said William T. Blew shall fail to pay and discharge the aforesaid debts with all costs pertaining to the same then to shall be lawful and right so soon as required in writing from under the hand of the said Henry Blew his son or assigns to sell up and sell to the highest bidder for Cash the aforesaid tracts of land after giving notice by advertisement ten days previous to the day of sale, and out of the proceeds pay the debts and costs and the surplus of any pay over to the said William T. Blew his son or assigns. In witness whereof the parties have set their hands and seals this day and date above written.
