 my friend and relation Francis Ann Shirout and daughter of Charles Shirout of said County but more
 especially for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars to me in hand paid the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged have given granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant
 bargain and sell unto the said Francis Ann Shirout One red and white Cow one black &
 white Calf and one red and white yearling and their full increase To Have and to Hold
 the above said Cow Calf and yearling unto the said Francis Ann Shirout her heirs Executors or
 assigns forever and the said John Leedsborough for himself his heirs Executors and administrators
 well for ever maintain and defend the right and title of her and to the said Cow Calf and yearling
 and their increase unto the said Francis Ann Shirout her heirs and assigns forever against
 the claim or demand of the said John Leedsborough his heirs Executor or administrator and
 against all and every person or persons whomsoever In Testimony whereof the said
John Leedsborough have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 4th day of
 January 1832

Gray This Deed made this 3rd of January 1832 Between Edwin Gray of the first part Letitia R
Edward of the second part and J R Gray of the third part: Witnesseth that whereas the said
Gray Edwin is pretty indebted to the said J R Gray in the sum of Three Hundred and twenty seven
 Dollars and fifty cents for and being desirous to secure the same to the said Gray both and cloth, hereby grant and assign
 to J R Gray unto the said Letitia R Edward his heirs & assigns and in consideration of One dollar to him the sum
 the 23rd of 1832 Edwin Gray in hand paid by the said Edward all the undivided interest in his father's Estate
 as he is entitled to have the said Edwin Gray by the last Will of his said father as also all the
 personal property now claimed by the said J R Gray at the date of his father's death and on which a Deed
 has been given to secure the purchase to Oct Brown the wife of J R Gray the difference being
 paid to said Edw well fully appear to designate the property above and also the undivided interest
 in a certain tract of land in Stafford County called the Spring Swamp plantation to the said
Edward his heirs & assigns against the claim of the said Edwin Gray or any person claiming under
 him upon which nevertheless that the said Edward after paying and satisfying the said J R Gray
 his heirs or assigns the aforesaid sum of Three Hundred and twenty seven dollars for the raising
 of which he is indebted to the said Gray agreeable to Law at and by the request of the said J R Gray
 his heirs and assigns shall pay over the balance to the said Edwin Gray his heirs or assigns. In
