All Witnesseth that Robert Wicks and Edwin Wicks Executors of William Wicks dec^d have given granted and sold unto by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto Gilbert Drury one Custom-trail or parcel of land containing by estimation two hundred and nine acres be the same more or less for and in consideration of the sum of Forty and thirty Eight dollars and bounded as more particularly set out and described in a Deed executed to William Wicks by Wiley Wiggins representative of Mel Pittman dec^d bearing date Sept^r 15th 1821 and more of record in the Clerk's Office of the County of Southampton reference being had to the deed and for a more full description of the said Land To have and to hold the said tract of land to him and his heirs forever free from the claim of the said Robert and Edwin Wicks and his heirs forever and the said Robert and Edwin Wicks Covenant and agree that having effected a sale of the above tract of land as Executors of William Wicks dec^d by virtue of his will do hereby warrant title as such Executors only.
