Concluded: This Indenture made this 5th day of May in the year of our Lord Christ 1832. Between James
Coomes debtor of the first part and Lawrence Joyner trustee of the second part and Samuel Joyner of the
third part: the Creditor all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia whereas the said James
Coomes jointly indebted unto the said Samuel Joyner in the sum of Sixty Dollars lawful money due by

and bearing date 16th day of April 1832 with interest thereon till paid to the said James Commeis owing
and deserves to be paid. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises
and also for the further sum of One dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said James Commeis
in hand paid by the said Lawrence Joyner at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James Commeis hath given granted bargained
and sold released and confirmed and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the said
Lawrence Joyner his heirs and assigns forever my tract of land containing thirty three acres and one
third to the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a pine in Sapee Dick's
old line formerly John Drayton line thence along said Samuel Joyner line to a pine in Sapee Dick's
old line a corner tree thence back by said Dick's line to a post oak in the old road known as
line to Lawrence Joyner's line to a red oak thence along Lawrence Joyner's line to the beginning with
the greater beds and furniture Beaufort six sitting Chairs one pine chest Dutch oven two pots with
all the interest right title claiming or demanding of the above mentioned land and property.
To have and to hold the said hereby granted or intended to be granted land and property
conveyed unto the said Lawrence Joyner his heirs and administrators and assigns forever and
the said James Commeis for himself his heirs Executors and assigns do hereby covenant and agree
to and with the said Lawrence Joyner his heirs &c in manner and form as followeth to say
that the said James Commeis his heirs Executors and administrators the aforesaid mentioned land
and property unto the said Lawrence Joyner his heirs Executors and assigns and assigns all
persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents upon trust now
hereby that the said Lawrence Joyner his heirs Executors and adm^rs shall permit the said James
Commeis to remain in quiet possession of the said land and property hereby convey and take profit
thereof to his own use until default be made in the payment of the sum of the aforesaid
forty dollars with interest either in the whole or in part and then upon this further trust that
the said Lawrence Joyner his heirs Executors and adm^rs or assigns shall and will so soon after the
comming of such default or payment as he his heirs Executors and assigns may think proper
or the said Samuel Joyner his heirs Executors and assigns shall request sell the land and
and property or such part thereof as he shall think proper for the purpose and shall proper
to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction after having fixed the time
and place of sale at his own discretion and giving ten days notice thereof at the courthouse
of this County and at as many other public places as he may think proper on some Conday
