This Indenture made this 19<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year 1832, between William D Clarke  
of the County of Southampton of the first part, James D Mapenning of the said County of the second  
part and Alexander Myrick, Sally Pope, William Lawrence and all the Creditors of the said William  
D Clarke of the third part. Whereas the said William D Clarke is partly indebted to George  
Examination of debt Dorell in the sum of for which the said Sally Pope bound as security, also to  
to D Mapenning Benjamin Dorell in the sum of for which the said Alexander Myrick is bound as  
Security and also to White and Weston in the sum of for which the said  
William Lawrence is bound as security. And whereas the said William D Clarke is  
indebted to divers other persons whose names and demands are stated and mentioned in the  
aforesaid Schedule, as also to others whose claims are not mentioned in the last schedule  
And whereas the said William D Clarke desirous effectually to secure, and have himself

D Mapenning his heirs, Executrix and administrators the following real and personal property  
that is to say all his the said William D Clarke's stock of Merchandise now or hereafter  
consisting of dry goods and general, including about 200 weight of Bacon one hundred head  
I Cm and calves, all his the said William D Clarke's stock of Hogs, one double Pig and Ham  
one Cwt and wheels, all his the said William D Clarke's household and kitchen furniture  
consisting of 5 Wds, 100 lbs of furniture  
make camp and Walnut Tables, 4 Small dressing tables, one side board and furniture and  
several fine flag bottom chairs, one broken set of common chairs, two slaves named John and Lucy
