This Indenture made this 19th day of June in the year 1832. between William D. Clarke of the County of Southampton of the first part, James D. M. A. P. M. of the said County of the second part and Alexander Myrick, Sally Pope, William Laurence and all the creditors of the said William D. Clarke of the third part: Whereas the said William D. Clarke is jointly indebted to Lewis Benjamin Bond in the sum of for which the said Sally Pope is bound as security, also to J. M. A. P. M. in the sum of for which the said Alexander Myrick is bound as security, and also to John and Weston in the sum of for which the said William Laurence is bound as security, and whereas the said William D. Clarke is indebted to several other persons whose names and demands are stated and mentioned in the annexed Schedule, as also to others whose claims are not mentioned in the said Schedule and whereas the said William D. Clarke desires effectually to secure, and save himself, the said Sally Pope, Alexander Myrick and William Laurence his securities as aforesaid against all loss and injury which may arise to them or either of them in consequence thereof and the said William D. Clarke also desires effectually to secure the payment of the debts due as aforesaid to all his said other creditors, after first applying the property herein after mentioned to the payment and satisfaction of the said three debts first above referred to This Indenture therefore Witnesseth, that the said William D. M. before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted bargained and sold, transferred and assigned, and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell transfer and assign unto the said James D. M. A. P. M. his heirs, Executors and assigns forever the following real and personal property that is to say all his the said William D. Clarke's stock of Merchandise now on hand consisting of dry good and groceries, including about 200 weight of Bacon one barrel head 2 cans and calves, all his the said William D. Clarke's stock of Hogs, one double pig and ham of 3 cwt and calves, all his the said William D. Clarke's household and kitchen furniture, 7 or 8 small dressing tables, 4 small dressing tables, one bed board and furniture and a dozen fine flag bottom chairs, one broken set of common chairs, two slaves named John and Mary
