This Indenture made the 13th day of January in the year of our Lord a thousand Eight hundred
and thirty two between Edwin Daugher of Southampton County Virginia of the one part and
Lawrence Daugher of Southampton County Virginia of the other part - witnesseth that the
said Edwin Daugher in consideration of one hundred dollars of lawful money of this command
to him in hand paid by the said Lawrence Daugher at or before the making and delivery
of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold an
by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Lawrence Daugher his heirs and assigns
a certain tract or parcel of land containing sixty acres more or less it being in the lower
part of Southampton County and bounded as follows. Beginning at a small gum in the Q-
prop. by a swamp a corner of Samuel Gardner thence out at 80. 00. 14.2 poles to a small pond
a corner on the bank of Henry Gourne dec^t 163. 11.4 poles to a corner on said Gardner's
thence S. 57. 07. 9 poles to a white oak a corner on James Ruggins, then along said James
Ruggins line at 80. 61. 0 poles to a corner in the Cyp of swamp thence back to a
pole to the beginning; together with all the advantages ornaments her, ornaments and
appurtenances whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of land, belonging or appertaining
with the same used or enjoyed or accepted & reputed; taken a known as part parcel or member
thereof or as belonging to the same or any part thereof and the reversion and reversion, remain-
der and remainder of early and other rents, issues and profits thereof and of every part and
parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the tenement
heretofore and all and singular other premises herein mentioned or intended to be buying
and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every one of their rights, members and
appurtenances unto the said Edwin Daugher his heirs and assigns forever to and for the
only proper use and behoof of him the said Edwin Daugher his heirs and assigns, and
the said Edwin Daugher for him self as Trustee, the said tract or parcel of land
with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned; unto the
said Edwin Daugher his heirs and assigns, free from the claim or claims of him the
said Edwin Daugher as Trustee and of all and every person whatsoever shall and will
defend and do warrant by these presents as trustee in Writing whereof the said
Edwin Daugher have hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above
written
