This Indenture made the 13th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred
 and thirty two between Edwin Daughtery of Southampton County, Virginia of the one part, and
 Lawrence Daughtery of Southampton County, Virginia of the other part. Witnesseth that the
 said Edwin Daughtery in consideration of one hundred dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth
 to him in hand paid by the said Lawrence Daughtery at or before the executing and delivery of
 these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and
 by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Lawrence Daughtery his heirs and assigns
 a certain tract or parcel of land containing sixty acres more or less it being in the lower
 part of Southampton County and bounded as follows. Beginning at a sweet gum in the Co-
 pper Swamp a Corner of Jeremiah Gardner thence out at 86.00 poles to a small pine
 a Corner on the line of Henry Gardner dec^d 163.00 poles to a Corner on said Gardner's line
 thence 107.00 poles to a white oak a Corner on James Leggins, then along said James
 Leggins line at 80.00 poles to a Gum in the Copper Swamp thence up said Swamp 20
 poles to the beginning, together with all the advantages, emoluments, hereditaments and
 appurtenances whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of land, belonging or appertaining or
 with the same used or enjoyed or accepted reputed; to have or to have as part, parcel or member
 thereof or as belonging to the same or any part thereof and the reversions and reversions, remain-
 der and remainder of early and other rents, issues and profits thereof and of every part and
 parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the tenements
 hereditaments and all and singular other premises herein mentioned or intended to be bargained
 and sold and every part and parcel thereof, with every one of their rights, members and
 appurtenances unto the said Lawrence Daughtery his heirs and assigns forever to and for the
 only proper use and behoof of him the said Lawrence Daughtery his heirs and assigns forever
 and the said Edwin Daughtery for himself as Trustee, the said tract or parcel of land
 with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned, unto the
 said Lawrence Daughtery his heirs and assigns, free from the claim or claims of him the
 said Edwin Daughtery as Trustee and of all and every person whatsoever shall and will
 defend and defend him by these presents, as Trustee in Witness whereof the said
 Edwin Daughtery have hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above
 written
