

Gray's Indenture made this day of _____ in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and thirty, between Richard C Gray and Louisa his wife of the County of Southampton and State of N.Y. of the one
 part and Henry Tenard of the said County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Richard C Gray and
 Louisa his wife for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to them in hand paid by
 the said Henry Tenard at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt is hereby
 acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and
 sell unto the said Henry Tenard all and singular the same one certain tract or parcel of land
 and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and State of N.Y. and in the Parish of Saint
 Luke's containing one hundred acres being the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit
 vizt a red oak in Henry Tenard's line a corner between Gray thence on near at Corner to a
 corner pine of Margaret P. Beale's thence on said Beale's line near a corner to a pine near the head of
 the meadow branch thence across the said head of the meadow thence down the side the branch
 near S.E. Corner to a pine thence on to a black gum thence on to a pine thence on to a black
 gum standing in the said branch thence down the branch to a maple a corner of Margaret P.
 Beale and Joseph Gray thence down the branch to said Thomas swamp thence down the
 Mill Swamp to corner for Trinchin Gray thence a straight line near all corner to a
 lightwood post near the dwelling house of the said Richard C Gray thence on a straight line
 to the first station together with all houses not houses water water courses in anywise apper-
 taining or thence belonging To have and to hold the said tract of land and premises with
 its appurtenances thence belonging to him the said Henry Tenard and his heirs forever and
 the said Richard C Gray and Louisa his wife do for themselves their heirs Executors and adminis-
 trators and assigns forever warrant and defend the lawful claim or claims of the said tract or
 parcel of land or any part thereof against all and every person or persons who shall or will
 claim or whosoever the said Richard C Gray and Louisa his wife have hereto set their hands

 and thirty one between William E. Lawrence of the one part and Alfred Edwards of the other part
 Witnesseth that the said William E. Lawrence for and in consideration of fifty seven dollars
 current money of this commonwealth to him in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these
 presents hath bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Alfred
 Edwards his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation Eighty seven
 and a half acres be the same more or less bounded by the lands belonging to Jesse Gardner, William
 Wells, Nathaniel Vaughan, and Henry Vaughan's estate and being the tract conveyed by Jesse
 Wells to the said William E. Lawrence in trust for the benefit of James Murphy as well
 appear by Deed recorded in the County Court of South Hampton and the said Jesse Wells
 having failed to comply with the terms of said trust, the said tract of land was on the 31st
 day of December last past sold to the highest bidder at public sale together with the remain-
