Containing One thousand thirty six acres and a half acres be the same more or less and bounded as  
follows: On the North by the Lands of Col<sup>o</sup> James Bragant On the West by the lands of Major  
Thomas Ridley On the South by the Lands of the late Col<sup>o</sup> Henry Blow deceased and On the  
East by a streamy River To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with its  
appurtenances and all the right title interest claim and demand of the said William B.  
Price, Elizabeth A. Price and Mary Price of me and to the same and every part and  
parcel thereof to the said Thomas Ridley his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper-
