This Indenture made this 14<sup>th</sup> of January 1832 Between James Jenkins of the County of Loudoun and Parish of a Attorney of the one part and Collier Kitcher of the same County and Parish of the other part: It Sheweth that the said James Jenkins and wife Matilda for and in consideration of the sum of fifty five dollars and 75<sup>cts</sup> money of Great Britain by the said Collier Kitcher the receipt whereof the said James Jenkins and wife do hereby acknowledge they and Comply have granted bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents have granted bargained and sold unto the said Collier Kitcher one certain tract or parcel of Land or 5<sup>th</sup> promised to be conveyed by and being in the County aforesaid containing by estimation two acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at the North a Corner a small persimmon tree thence E. to a Black gum a corner in the branch thence up the said branch to the Quater road thence up the said road to a corner on the left side of the road a Spruce and post oak thence a N. E. corner to the beginning a line of marked trees between Major John Wick and the said Jenkins line to the first station. To go then with all houses and fixtures and appurtenances Gardens Orchards vineyard Combs and ularies whatsover belonging or in any way appertaining To have and to hold the said lands to him the said Collier Kitcher to him and his heirs forever and the said James Jenkins and wife Matilda for themselves doth warrant and forever defend by these presents any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part thereof.
