Douglas or his legal representatives, shall sell all the above said property hereby conveyed or intended to be hereby conveyed at public auction to the highest bidder for cash by first advertising the time and place of such sale by advertisement posted up at three or more public places in the neighborhood of said Douglas ten days previous to such sale and out of the proceeds of such sale the said Robert P. Barnes or his legal representatives after paying and satisfying all the expenses attending the execution of these presents shall pay the above said debt of fifty dollars and the interest that may have accrued thereon unto him the said D. Cornell or his heirs Executors or assigns or so much as may then be due on said note, and the surplus of any pay unto the said Jesse H. Douglas his Order or assigns but if the said Jesse H.
