This Indenture made and entered into this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of January 1832 between Lewis Feltz plaintiff  
and Benjamin Edwards of the first part, Cuthbert D<sup>r</sup> Barham of the second part, and Benjamin  
Edwards of the third part. Whereas the said Benjamin Edwards is security for Lewis Feltz to a  
Bank of thirty dollars due sometime in August 1832 and the said Feltz being desirous to insur-  
mify the said Edwards against any loss which he may sustain in the security aforesaid  
nath granted bargained and sold (as well as for the premises above mentioned) as of the consideration of the  
sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Cuthbert D<sup>r</sup> Barham before the delivery and  
delivery of these presents to the said Cuthbert D<sup>r</sup> Barham his Executor by the following property to wit  
two beds and furniture two pine chests, one Cupboard 2 bureaus and one pine table one pair  
parcel of Dr. its tools, sash window frames and parts Kitchen furniture &c. To have and to  
hold to his proper uses and benefit forever upon trust nevertheless that the said Barham shall  
permit the said Feltz to remain in quiet possession of the above mentioned property and take  
the profits thereof to his own proper uses until the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 1832 at the time the  
said Bank is ordered, and at which time if the said Edwards shall request the said  
Barham after giving reasonable Notice of the time and place of sale, except to sell the said  
property or as much thereof as will be sufficient for the payment and out of the proceeds of the  
said sale first pay the costs and expenses thereof, then pay and satisfy the debt aforesaid  
for which the said Edwards is said Feltz security or so much thereof as may be due at the  
time and the balance if any pay over to the said Feltz or his legal representative and the said  
Feltz Covenant with said Edwards that he is proprietor of an absolute estate of fee simple in the  
property above conveyed, and that he will forever warrant and defend the same against himself
