This Indenture made and entered into this 19<sup>th</sup> day of January 1832. Between Josiah Joyner of Southampton County of the first part, Edgar H. Parsons of the second part, Nathl. Strong and Co of the third part: Whereas the said Josiah Joyner is indebted to the said Nathl. Strong & Co in the just sum of Eighty dollars and 26 Cents due by bond of equal date herewith, and is desirous to secure the payment of the same to them, at or thro' Indenture Well Trofith that for and in Consideration of the premises and of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Parsons, before the sealing and delivery of these presents, he the said Josiah Joyner hath assigned hold and delivered and by these presents doth bargain sell and deliver unto the said Parsons a certain tract or parcel of land, containing mitty acres more or less and bounded as follows On the north by Land owned by Francis Wilcox, and Abel Waddell on the east by Land belonging to the heirs of Henry Esley on the South by Benjamin Cobb's Land and on the West by William Cobb's land, also there beed some shell and Kitchen furniture One son and ten pigs 1 Bay mare, Bacon Corn and fodder corn on hand and the undying Crop of Corn and fodder. To have and to hold to his only proper use and behoof forever Upon trust, nevertheless that the said Josiah Joyner is to retain possession of the said Land furniture &c until the said Nathl. Strong & Co or their assigns shall direct, the said Parsons or his Exors or Adms to take possession of the same and after duly advertising the same and placing of sale for ten days the said Parsons as Trustee as aforesaid shall sell the said Land furniture Hogs (swine), Corn & fodder &c or as much of said property as may be necessary to satisfy the debt and interest aforesaid to the highest bidder for Cash, and of the proceeds of such sale pay first the expenses of the Trust, then the debt aforesaid with the interest which may have accrued thereon, and the balance if any, pay to the said Josiah Joyner or his order. And if the said Josiah Joyner at any time before the said sale shall have been made, shall pay the said sum of money with the interest thereon and the Costs hereof then the said Nathl. Strong & Co. covenant that the said Land furniture Hogs, swine and fodder &c shall be fully released to him the said Josiah Joyner of this indenture and the said Joyner for himself and heirs, covenants that the said Land furniture hog swine and Corn fodder &c shall be delivered up for their purposes whatsoever applicable for - In testimony whereof the said several parties have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first herein written
