This Indenture made this 26th of January in the year of our Lord 1832 between Thomas Bryan of the first part, James Bick of the second part and John Donegoy of the third part all of the County of Southampton State of Virginia: Whereas the said Thomas Bryan stands greatly indebted to the said John Donegoy in the sum of thirty seven dollars & 13 Cents by note bearing date the 17th day of January 1832 and on demand the 13th September 1832 and for this further consideration that whereas the said John Donegoy stands bound as security for the said Thomas Bryan to Robert and Edwin Hicks due by note bearing date 12th December 1831 for the sum of sixty four dollars and 96 cents due the 13th September 1832. And also a note due to Dr. Orris et Morris for the sum of twelve dollars and 20 cents due the 1832. And some other bond or bonds or account which the said John Donegoy may hereafter stand Security for which bonds debts &c as well as a sum of money due the said Thomas Bryan it residing and desirous to secure the said John Donegoy from any damage which he may sustain or be likely to sustain in consequence of his being security as aforesaid. Now This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the promises and also the further consideration of one dollar to the said Thomas Bryan in hand paid by the said James Bick at and before the sealing and delivery of this present instrument whereof as hereby acknowledged by the said Thomas Bryan both given granted bargained sold released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell release and confirm to the said James Bick his heirs and assigns for ever the following property to wit One house one single gig with an iron two Cents and harness on yoke of Oxen, and three Cows, twenty eight head of hog & swine, desks and one book Case, six tables, three Chests, three trunks six feather beds six round blinds, Curtains, twelve slender chairs six framed desks, batton curtain desks, thirty Easters plates, four pewter dishes, two basins, six bowls, six pitchers, two candle sticks, Coffee pots, four dinters, wine glass and tumblers, four jugs one demijohn, six bottles and jars two pairs for iron, Seven silver, tea spoons two looking glasses, two yards blue cloth, two Pewter flag, three dozen cases knives and forks, four water, two Dutch ovens, three pots, two copper pans, four trays, four tubs, two sugar pots, racks three bush hoes, five plough hoes, forty Cedar Casks, four Candle sticks four setting axes, one pair wedges, two bridles and two saddles on table cloths eight towels, six pewter spoons, two flat irons and four turn heads of sheep &c the aforesaid hereby conveyed property. To have and to hold unto the said James Bick his heirs &c adms and assigns forever and the said Thomas Bryan for himself his Executrix and Administratrix hereby covenants, promises and agrees to and with the said James Bick in manner and form following that is to say that the said Thomas Bryan his Executrix and Administratrix, the aforesaid property hereby conveyed, to the said James Bick against all persons whatsoever shall and will remain and forever defend by these presents upon trust nevertheless that the said James Bick shall permit the said Thomas Bryan to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said hereby conveyed property, and to for of its benefit to his own use, until default be made in the whole or in part, or whenever such default shall be made in either of the notes, on which the said John Donegoy is bound, as security as aforesaid. And thereupon further trust that the said James Bick his heirs or assigns shall do soon after the happening of default of payment, or on the institution of a suit on either of the Notes, as aforesaid in which the said John Donegoy is bound, as security for the said Thomas Bryan, as the said John Donegoy his heirs &c and Administratrix shall request, sell the said above mentioned property or such part
