Now know ye the said James Barcum being willing and desirous to indemnify and secure the payment of the above debt but more especially for the sum of one dollar to him without paid by him the said Harrison Cobb before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof on her day next viz. that the said James Barcum hath granted bargained and sold, conveyed and sold these presents, grant bargained and sold to him the said Naughton in full for him and assigns forever the following property to wit. A horse 2 Good Head of Cattle, Three 3 fathoms of Bed and furniture all my household and Kitchen furniture my farm implements my outfit all kinds now made by me now and every other one made until the above debt is paid to him the said Naughton in full for him and assigns forever.
