This Indenture made this 3rd day of January in the Year of our Lord One thousand
Eight hundred and thirty two Between Paul Drury and George Grey acting Commissioners
appointed by the County Court of Southampton of the said County and State of Virginia of
the one part, and Joseph E. Clark of the said County and State of the other part witness
eth that for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five dollars the receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged by the said Commissioners which granted bargains and by these pres-
ents do grant bargains sell and confirm unto the said Joseph E. Clark and his heirs
forever a certain tract or parcel of Land, which Jno. Hilt did Survey and prepared
with Containing forty four acres it to be the same more or less situated in the County
of Southampton and bounded on the South by the lands of said Jno. Hilt late on
the West by the lands of Elizabeth Grey on the North and East by the Land belonging
to the estate of John Burham dec'd and which will appear more fully to say the
said Land was purchased by the said Hilt after making his last Will and Testament
from Commissioners which Land belonged to the Estate of Carter Matherly. To have
and to hold the same with all the improvements and benefits therunto belonging unto
the said Clark his heirs and assigns forever which said Land was the said Hilt's
and Grey acting as Commissioners to demand and recover before the title of said
unto the said Clark and his heirs forever against the claim or claims of every person
