 Virginia Witnesseth that the said Lemuel Carver and Nancy his wife for and  
 consideration of the sum of One hundred and thirty two dollars to them in hand paid by the  
 said Edw and Crumpler at and before the making and delivery of these presents the  
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said Lemuel Carver and Nancy his  
 wife have granted bargain and sold and by these presents do and each of them do  
 grant bargain and sell unto the said Edward Crumpler his heirs and assigns a certain  
 tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and  
 marked and bounded as follows Beginning at a Black gum tree I call it Corner between  
 E. S. to a Black gum on E. S. of the road at 83 p. to a stake on the line of James  
 Gardner then S 77. 10. 63 p. to a burnt gum at Sta. W. 18 p. to ditto on Henry Cress S. 10. 23 p. to  
 point S 7. 85 p. to red oak at N. 83 p. to water oak at Sta. E. 10 p. to burnt gum S 56. 62 p. to  
 begin. Containing thirty three acres more or less. the seven in and seven in remainder  
 remainder, apart and other uses and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof  
 and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the premises and appurtenances thereto
