Goodwyn of the other part with specialties shall be said John F. Barrow and Mary F. his wife hath for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and twenty dollars current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said William B. Goodwyn the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged & sold unto the said William B. Goodwyn and by these presents do grant bargain and sell one certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton being Lot Number Four which was assigned to the said John F. Barrow by writing an order of Southampton Court in the tract called Barlow's Containing by estimation thirty four acres be the same more or less and the said John F. Barrow and Mary F. his wife doth covenant and agree to and with the said William B. Goodwyn the title to the aforesaid Land and premises to warrant and forever defend against the claim of themselves or claims of all and every other person or persons whatever. This Indenture made and entered into this 28th day of February 1830 between John Moore and Delila his wife the one part and Stuart Edwards of the other part with specialties that the said John Moore and Delila his wife in consideration of four hundred dollars lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid at a before the executing and delivery of these presents. Have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Stuart Edwards his heirs or assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land being one of the tracts sold by Commissioners of the Court to make distribution among the heirs of William Edwards and divided by them to the aforesaid John Moore the parts and parcels bounding thereon be seen by Taylor Edwards Deed to the said William Edwards and recorded in the County Court and Containing by estimation One hundred and fifty four acres be the same more or less together with the remainder or remainders reversions or reversionary and other parts fees and profits and every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land together with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular the premises therein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof unto the said Stuart Edwards his heirs or assigns forever.
