This Indenture made and entered into on the 20<sup>th</sup> of February in the year of our Lord 1832 Between James Bryant and Nancy Bryant his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Lewis Morrell of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said James Bryant and Nancy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five dollars Current money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Lewis Morrell at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged Have granted, conveyed, sold, aliened, Enfeoffed and Confirmed and by these presents do and each of them doth grant, convey, sell, alien, unfeoff and Confirm unto him the said Lewis Morrell his heirs and assigns forever, all that right title interest claim or demand of us and to us contained divided part or parcel of Land of which Dorey Bryant father of said James Bryant died seized and possessed known by the name of the Hurst plantation Situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of St Lukes containing by estimation one hundred acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of said Lewis Morrell, William Bryant and others together with all right title interest claim or demand of us and to us proportionable part of the aforesaid part or parcel of undivided Land and premises with its appurtenances
