Witness This Indenture made this Eighteenth day of February in the year one thousand Eight hundred  
and thirty two between Bartham M'num of the first part Joseph H. Parker of the second part  
Parker trustee and Samuel Bartham, J. S. D. Parker and George A. G. Bartham of the third part (witnesses)  
appointed by the County of Southampton to sell and dispose of the Land of which Edwin Kelly  
did hold and possessed. Whereas the said Bartham M'num is greatly entitled to the above  
Commissaries Saml. Bartham, J. S. D. Parker and George A. G. Bartham in the sum of four  
hundred and five dollars to be paid on or before the Tenth day of October next ensuing after  
said hearing date the 18<sup>th</sup> day of February 1832 moneth appear where I do the said  
Bartham M'num is willing to secure now the said Indenture will witness that for ever  
in Consideration of the premises and also for the further Consideration of the sum of one dollar  
of Lawful money of Virginia to the said Bartham M'num in hand paid by the said  
Joseph H. Parker at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby  
acknowledged by the said Bartham M'num has given granted bargained and sold alredy in full  
released and confirmed and by these presents doth give and grant bargains sell alredy in full  
confirmed to the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel  
of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and Containing by late Survey  
One hundred and forty four and one half acres to the same more or less and bounded  
as follows viz Beginning at a White Oak on the North side of the Raccoon Branch or  
Bartham M'num's line then along a line of marked trees northwardly to a Black  
or sweet gum tree Gringo's line then westwardly along said Black line to the  
old Road thence along said Road to a Cherry tree in said M'num's line thence south  
wardly along said M'num's line to said Gringo's line down said Road to the beginning  
With all and Singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of Land  
Belonging or in any way appertaining To have and to hold the said hereby granted  
premises with its appurtenances unto the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs and assigns  
forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs  
and assigns forever. And the said Bartham M'num for himself his heirs Executors & adms  
doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs &c  
and assigns forever in manner and form following that is to say that the said  
Bartham M'num his heirs &c the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and premises and  
its appurtenances unto the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs &c against all persons  
whatsoever shall and will command and for ever defend by these presents upon trust & trust  
it up that the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs &c shall permit the said Bartham M'num  
to remain in quiet and peaceful possession of the said tract or parcel of Land and premises  
with their appurtenances until default be made in the payment of the said sum of  
four hundred and five dollars above in the whole or in part. And then upon the first  
trust that he the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs &c or his representatives hereby entit-  
ed to all share and will so soon after the happening of such default of payment  
as the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs &c may think proper or the said Joseph
