This Indenture made this 16th day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred
 and thirty two between Lewis Worrell of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part
 and William Bryant of County of the same County and State of the other part. (Witnesseth) That the
 said Lewis Worrell for and in consideration of the sum of twenty Eight dollars and no more five
 Cents bore out money to him in hand paid by the said William Bryant at or before the making
 and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is her day actum judges Nathaniel Longmire
 and sold alonged and signed and Confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell
 alien enfeoff and Confirm unto the said William Bryant his heirs and assigns forever one half
 of the interest purchased by said Lewis Worrell from James Bryant in a certain tract of part
 of Land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of St
 Luke's known by the name of the Marsh tract of Land which contains by estimation One
 hundred acres (more or less) one half of the interest in the said tract that the said Lewis Worrell
 purchased from James Bryant and hereby conveying to said William Bryant contains
 twelve and a half acres more or less which is laid off to said William Bryant & forming
 his part of the said tract of Land the dividing line between said Lewis Worrell and
