sixty two between Lewis Worrell of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and
Richard Worrell of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Lewis
Worrell for and in consideration of the sum of Three thousand dollars Current money to him in hand
paid by the said Richard Worrell at or before the ensaing and delivery of these presents the wife
whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold alway unfeoffed and confirmed
by these presents doth grant bargain sell alway unfeoffed and confirm unto him the said Richard
Worrell his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract of land situate lying and
being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Luke Containing by a recent
Survey seven hundred and thirty acres be the same more or less including the Land formerly belong-
ing to Edmund and Joshua Thorp Robert Daugtry etc. the Creekham plantation and part of
the Land formerly belonging to Bart. Bailey etc. and bounded as followeth Beginning at the corner
of the Alton swamp in the road leading from the Cope hys to Alton a corner of Thomas B. Worrell
