Whereas I Edward Gray of the County of Smithampton did on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of November 1883 execute  
 a deed in trust to Jesse Drury for the benefit of Orris A. Brown and of Thomas Gray in which  
 I conveyed unto said real and personal estate to secure the sum of Eight thousand eight dollars and  
 well more fully appearing referred to the said Deed; and whereas the said Edward Gray  
 stands fully indebted to Robert Murrell in the sum of sixty five dollars and being desirous to  
 send to him the said debt I therefore authorized and gave Jesse Drury the power to advance  
 in case he should sell the aforesaid property so conveyed and trust after paying the said debt
