This Indenture made and entered into this 20th day of March 1832 by and between John Hart
of the first part Henry T. Smith of the second part and William Harrison of the third part
mutually chosen as Justice of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witness that
the said John Hart is justly indebted to the said William Harrison the sum and
full sum of one hundred and thirty two Dollars for being security to a Bond executed to John
Hart bearing date about the 20th March 1832 with Interest from the date of said Bond
and also a Bond executed to Samuel Cabot for the amount of two hundred Dollars bearing
date with interest from the 25th December 1832. The said John Hart is willing and desirous
to secure to the said William Harrison upon this Indenture a certain part of the sum of
one dollar to the said Hart and paid by the said Henry T. Smith as trustee the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John Hart
having been granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell
unto the said H. T. Smith his heirs and assigns to the use and behoof of the said William Harrison
the following property to wit One negro man named Daniel One negro woman named
Levina and three negro boys named Frank the above named Peter and next
Amelia To have and to hold the above mentioned property unto the said H. T. Smith
his heirs and assigns for ever and the said John Hart for himself his heirs & assigns
and agree to defend the right and title of the said property to the said H. T. Smith his heirs
and assigns in what the said William Harrison shall permit the said John Hart to remain as
quiet possession of the same until a default be made in the payment of the above Bond &
interest or until the said Harrison shall sustain any injury by the same and upon they
further trust that the said H. T. Smith his heirs & assigns shall let the said property and
the proceeds of the sales first pay all cost attending this trust and then pay the debt and interest
as aforesaid after giving ten days previous notice of the time and place of sales at three or more
public places in the neighborhood and out of the proceeds of the sales first pay all cost of
them pay the debt and interest and the surplus if any to the said John Hart his
heirs & assigns. And if the said sum of money with interest thereupon shall be paid to the
said Hart and Cabot so that he shall be saved harmless from this obligation and
his heirs or assigns remain in full force and effect. In Testimony whereof the parties aforesaid
