This Indenture made and entered into this 20th day of March 1832 by and between John Hart of the first part Henry T. Smith of the second part and William Harrison of the third part mutually covenants as Witness of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereas the said John Hart is justly indebted to the said William Harrison the sum of one hundred and thirty two Dollars for being security to a Bond executed to John Harrison full sum of one hundred and thirty two Dollars for being security to a Bond executed to John Harrison dated about the 20th March 1832 with Interest from the date of said Bond and also a Bond executed to Samuel Calvert for the amount of two hundred Dollars being date with interest from the 25th December 1832. The said John Hart is willing and desirous to secure to the said William Harrison now this Presentments with respect that for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to the said Hart sum paid by the said Henry T. Smith as witness the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged as he the said John Hart hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said H. T. Smith his heirs and assigns to the use and behoof of the said William Harrison the following property to wit One negro man named Daniel One negro woman named Levisa and three negro boys named Frank the above named Preston and next Ameluck To have and to hold the above mentioned property unto the said H. T. Smith his heirs and assigns for ever and the said John Hart for hims self his heirs &c. doth warrant and agree to defend the right and title of the said property to the said H. T. Smith his heirs and assigns in that the said William Harrison shall permit the said John Hart to remain in quiet possession of the same until default be made in the payment of the above Bonds interest or until the said Harrison shall sustain any injury by the same and upon they further trust that the said H. T. Smith his heirs &c. shall let the said property and let the proceeds of the sales first pay all cost attending this trust and then pay the debt and what as aforesaid after giving ten days previous notice of the time and place of sales at three or more public places in the neighborhood and out of the proceeds of the sales first pay all cost & then pay the debt and interest and the surplus if any to the said John Hart his heirs &c. But if the said sum of money with interest thereupon shall be paid to the said Hart and Calvert so that he shall be saved harmless from this obligation and his heirs &c. shall remain in full force and effect.
