 So thirty two Between Edmund Thorp and Thos B. McNeill two of the Commissioners appointed by a Deed
 of the County Court of Southampton bearing date December Term 1831 to sell the tract or parcel of Land
 lying and being in the aforesaid County of which John a Merchant died seized and possessed and which
 was the said tract or parcel of Land was sold by the Commissioners aforesaid in pursuance of the Deed aforesaid
 On Tuesday the 31st day of January 1832 and Lafayette Brown became the purchaser thereof for the
 sum of eight hundred and fifty two dollars Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the Commissioners

 Arquis David and John to have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of Land and
 premises together with its appurtenances unto the said Lafayette Brown or in any way appertaining unto
 him the said Lafayette Brown his heirs and assigns forever and the said Edmund Thorp
 and Thomas B. McNeill Commissioners as aforesaid for themselves and each of their heirs Executors
 and assigns the tract or parcel of Land and premises with its appurtenances to him the said
 Lafayette Brown his heirs and assigns shall and lawfully warrant and forever defend as for
