for the purpose and shall then a power to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at their own discretion and giving twenty days notice of the time and place of sale by sufficient advertisement at public places and out of the town meeting from such sales I shall after satisfying the chargers thereof and all other expenses attending the same pay to the said Stephen Murdoch his Executor a sum of eight hundred and eight dollars and nine dollars and fifty four cents, and also the sum of one hundred and eighty seven and nineteen cents with the interest which may accrue thereon and the balance of any sum so paid to the said Nathaniel Rochester or any person or persons legally authorized to receive the same, but if the whole of the said sum of eight hundred and nine dollars and fifty four cents and the sum of one hundred and eighty seven and nineteen cents shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Stephen Murdoch his Executor a leg of this obligation to be so declared to remain unfilled and written. of the first part John Pick of the second part and Jacob Barnes of the third part all of the County of Southampton State
of New York whereas the said John Pick on the 28th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred
and thirty known to the said John Pick to have the payment of the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars to the said
Jacob Barnes due by indenture of that date coming to the said Henry Blen his heirs and assigns the
following property to wit all the Land estate which the said John Pick had any interest in at that time lying
and being in the County of Southampton and more especially the tract of land or hold the said Pick, now lies
which land is bound by the lands of the following names from time George Williams, Henry Mills
Stephen Mills and the above named Jacob Barnes and supposed to contain about sixty thousand
of land the more or less notwithstanding what may be inferred further either
and pumps in the said Indenture mentioned and which lies in the executing and delivering of
the said Deed of Trust the said John Pick hath fully satisfied and paid to the said Jacob Barnes

Barnes doth hereby acknowledge Now this Indenture witnesseth that for the consideration aforesaid
as well as for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid by the said John Pick
to the said Henry Blen aforesaid before the executing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is acknowledged
the said Henry Blen and the agent and assignee of the said Jacob Barnes signed by his
party to these presents and the said Jacob Barnes his heirs and assigns and sold remise aforesaid
Confirms by these presents to grant bargain and sell unto the said John Pick
all the lands right title interest claims and demands both at Law and in Equity which the said Henry
Blen and Jacob Barnes have or hold the said tract in the Land above described To have and to
hold the said tract or parcel of Land to the said John Pick his heirs Executors and assigns
forever to the only proper use and benefit of whom the said John Pick his heirs Executors and assigns
