This Indenture made and entered into on this 23rd day of March 1832 by and between Robert & Lucy Rogers his wife as the one part and Edmund Barnes of the other part both parties of the County of Southampton in the State of New York this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of twenty dollars to them the said Robert & Lucy Rogers and Lucy his wife and in consideration of the sum of twenty dollars and delivery of these bonds unto the full receipt of which is fully acknowledged they the said Robert & Lucy Rogers and Lucy his wife have and do hereby convey and sell to Barnes and Edmund Barnes his heirs and assigns forever all right title interest and estate in and to the following described land or tract of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded by the lands of the following named persons to wit on the North by Martha Ruth on the East and South by Henry Thorpe on the west by Berg Trans and the purchaser shall take and own forty seven acres of land by the same more or less it being the identical land which was a legacy to Mary Rogers widow and widow of Oliver Rogers deceased her son and now the wife of the purchaser. To have and to hold the said lot tract and parcel of land described aforesaid to him the said Edmund Barnes his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim of them the said Robert & Lucy Rogers and Lucy heirs of or either of them their or either of their heirs and also free from the claim of all and every other person or persons whatsoever will as such warrant and defend by these presents against all persons whom so ever the said tract or lot of land to him the said Edmund Barnes his heirs and assigns forever.
