any part or parcel thereof with every of her right number and appurtenances unto the said
Bradburn his heirs and assigns forever and for the only purpose and intent of him the said Col.
Bradburn his heirs and assigns forever and the said Lucy Griffen for herself and her heirs the said
Bradburn with and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned the said
Col. Bradburn his heirs and assigns free from the claims of her the said Lucy Griffen or his heirs before and
every person or persons who ever shall and will warrant and forum defend by these presents before

This Indenture made the 7th day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand Eighty
and thirty two Between Sarah Evans of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia and wife
of the County of Madison and State of Alabama. Witnesseth that whereas the said Henry Gru.
has this day paid unto the said Sarah Evans the sum of four hundred and twenty nine dollars
contingent the amount of a Rent due to the said Sarah for the purchase of a certain negro slave
named Willis and whereas a certain fellow named Barnes has brought before the Justices of the
County of Southampton and State of North Carolina against the said William Gru.
to recover the said Negro or the amount of his value and the said Sarah being willing and desirous
indemnify and save himself the said Henry from all recovery against him in the suit before
now for and in consideration of the premises the said Gru. doth bargain and sell unto the
Henry Gru. the following negro slaves named Martha May and Henry upon the following
conditions that if the said Col. Wm. Barnes shall recover the said Worthington Gru. in the
suit aforesaid any damages costs or charges then it shall be paid and the said Gru. is
willing that the said Wm. Gru. shall after giving two days notice sell at public sale the aforesaid
slaves aforesaid and out of the proceeds of such sale pay and satisfy him of all such damage
costs and charges as may be recovered against him in the suit aforesaid by the said Col. Wm. Gru.
