Summons. This Indenture made this 19<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand  
Eight hundred and thirty two. Whereas Lemuel B. Summerville in his lifetime was trustee to a debt  
given by Anthony Andrews to the said Summerville for the benefit of John Langford sonne whereof since the said  
the said Lemuel B. Summerville has departed this life leaving the property named in the said debt  
unpaid and Mary A. Summerville the wife of the said Lemuel has according to Law administered on the

Barry Stephen Andrews and Albert Andrews To have and to hold the said Land to the  
said Hawkins Pond with all its tenement and hereditaments to all and singular the premises herein  
before intended to be sold and may part and parcel thereof with every of their rights, covenants and  
appurtenances unto the said Hawkins Pond his heirs and assigns to and for the only uses, uses
