 and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Have bargained and sold
 and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said Edward Drake his heirs and assigns
 a certain tract or parcel of Land containing by the late survey with the division of Joseph Drury
 Land among the Legates fifty three acres being situate in the Land now owned
 by Edward Butler, on the South west of Land & number 4. owned by Sally Drury on the North East
 a tract of Land and on the East by Henry Briggs together with all the Lands heronunto inclosed
 pastures, woodlands, ways, water courses and privileges whatsover to them and belonging or
 appertaining or with the same or any part thereof and the revenues and reversions remainder and
 remainders rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof. That as and to hold
 the said tract or parcel of Land with the hereditaments and all and singular when the premises
 hereinbefore mentioned or extended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof
 with every of the covenants conditions and appurtenances unto the said Edward Drake his heirs and
 assigns forever to for the only for service and behoof of him the said Edward Drake his heirs and
 assigns forever. And the said Samuel Drury for himself and his heirs the said tract or parcel of
 Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said
 Edward Drake his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim or claims of him the said Samuel
 Drury his or either of his heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall now and do
