This Indenture made this 17th day of April one thousand Eight hundred and
thirty two Between John Vick and Sally his wife of the County of Southampton and State of
Virginia of the one part and Henry Thimble of the aforesaid County and State of the other part. It is
expressly that the said John Vick and Sally his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one
hundred and Eighty dollars to them in hand paid by the said Henry Thimble at or before the
making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and given
bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Henry
Thimble his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in
the aforesaid County of Southampton and State of Virginia and in the Parish of Saint Luke's
Containing by estimation fifty three acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit:
Beginning at a lightwood post a corner in George Williams line thence down the fork road
a lightwood stump a corner in said Williams line thence across a narrow lane to a post
thence on to gunpowder a corner in Jacob Rame's line thence near a corner to a post
a corner in said Rame's line thence near a corner to a post a corner in Andrew M. Thimble's
line thence along said M. Thimble's line to the beginning together with all houses and
