Writ of Seal of Trust executed by the said Lemuel Daugtry On the 9<sup>th</sup> day of September  
1829 and of record in the Clerk's Office of said County by the said Lemuel Daugtry and Thomas Holland  
to the said Lemuel Daugtry as consideration of part of land being and being worth of the  
County of Southampton adjoining the Lands of James Garrison John & Benjamin Carter  
One hundred acres more or less as trustee for Slop Parker in order to secure the payment of a  
certain Debt due Said Parker and as the aforesaid Debt will be paid when the same  
has been of late fully paid off as discharged by the said Thomas Holland and son  
quarterly the said Writ of Seal being void and of no effect This Indenture therefore  
further witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the  
further consideration of one dollar to him the said Lemuel Daugtry in hand
