Agustino Bishop of the first part William Blow of the second part and Thomas Poole
of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia WITNESSETH that
whereas the said Agustino Bishop stands jointly indebted to the said Thomas Poole
in the sum of Forty one dollars and twenty four cents due by promissory note bearing date
with their present and on demand the 12th day October 1832 and the said Agustino
Bishop being desirous to sume to the said Thomas Poole the amount of the aforesaid
Note do hereby agree for that purpose to convey and also in consideration of one dollar
100. 26/1832 certain property to the said William Blow to wit One feather bed and furniture and
down one little Eleven head of hog all my Crop of Corn and Cotton for the present year
with this provis that there shall be enough to satisfy William Newton and James
Poole for rent of said Crop land &c in time nevertheless that if the said Agustino
Bishop should fail to discharge the said note of forty one dollars and twenty four
cents on or before the 12th October 1832 Then it shall be the duty of the said William
Blow at the request of the said Thomas Poole to set up and sell to the highest bidder
having previously given legal notice of the same the aforesaid property herein named for
cash 100⁰⁰ money and the proceeds of said sale to be applied in the following manner
by the said Blow first pay and discharge all cost attending the execution of this Indenture
